

Ane Brun- Do You Remember

There will be an extraordinary Dane vote concerning the European international Police and Judicial co-operation. 'Yes please', is the obvious rational respond for the great majority of civilized Danes. EUROJUST, EUROPOL and CEPOL are essential to protect themselves against the overwhelming international organized crime. However, powerful minorities of international criminal organizations do proactively oppose such hardening of law and order, - obviously. They will most certainly manipulate political campaigns in their cloaked ways. It might even appear as legitimate political oppositions by respected politicians. The outcome might even alter, if unaware of such ongoing psychosocial 'Underworld' Games.

This extraordinary Dane referendum can be fatal for any nation in the European continent as well. In a worst-case scenario (5D), Denmark might become a 'Pirate Bay', a 'Kardemomme State', an 'Outlaw Haven', within the European Union. Metaphorically, the Dane legal system might operate as an infected firewall, out of control. The previously mentioned 'CSC vs Pirate Bay' -case clearly shows the long-term potential irreversible damages for European civilizations (UU 2015.juni.05). Therefore, it is legal for EUROJUST, EUROPOL and CEPOL to counter-fight criminal manipulations of the upcoming Dane referendum, - while Denmark still has valid treaties with the pan-European authorities.

Denmark, Ireland and UK, have various opt-outs (forbehold) from the Police and Judicial Cooperation Provisions that were incorporated into EU law with the Amsterdam Treaty. Denmark was granted some favors that ends in 2016, but Danes can now choose to opt-in on Criminal, Civil, Family and Commercial law, in addition to police and legal cooperation (annex to Protocol 22 to the Lisbon Treaty). The Dane referendum is about accepting 22 of the 33 directives in order to secure police cooperation and civil legal rights. The opt-in model will allow Denmark to participate in the existing JHA-legislation and any future legislation in this area. Migration policies are not included in the package, - even though it seems to be promoted as a major campaign issue by the opposition.

This UU theme will set a foundation to the following psychosocial analysis of the political Games to come. Some theoretical explanations are necessary though. First of all, the 3^3 model is explained in UU 2014.sept.12. In brief and in this relation, the 3D model is adapted to European parliamentary systems with the three constitutional Powers; the Legislative, the Executive and the Judicial powers (LEJ). That is similar to the Danish and Norwegian: LUD ('Lovgivende', 'Udøvende' and 'Dømmende'). Moreover, the Parliament is similar to the Legislative power, the public sector is similar to the Executive power and the court is similar to the Judicial power. These are bound to the Parliamentary principles of 'division of power' and the 'rule by law', which are maintained by the Police and Legal systems. Utmost vital to any civilization is that their Penalty laws that prevents and removes the most damaging crimes to society. The European nations that signed the International legal agreements of EU, ECHR and UN decades ago, should immediately ratify, and execute them as national law. However, - political and criminal corruption have certainly been influential. Dane LEJ needs strengthening by international cooperation, - in order to maintain their civil democracy.

Historically, the collapse of the Nordic Union happened when the Roma3 was formed half a millennium ago. Even the CdE (Coup d'Etat) in Roma1 and Roma2 are fundamentally relevant to the upcoming Dane referendum (UU 2014.okt.31). More relevant is the European nations' migration from EFTA to EEC in the '70s that Norden could not make. However, both the Danish and Norwegian democratic Parliaments were in great favor to join EEC (EU) and free themselves from the coldwar bounds to SU and US (UU 2014.dec.05). Somehow, someone demanded a democratic advisory referendum prior to the Parliamentary signing of the Maastricht Treaty. The computerized referendum showed a minor disapproval in both

Denmark and Norway. The results were claimed to overrule the Parliament's majority and rejection of the EEC Treaty.

Shortly after, the Norwegian Parliament signed the EEA Treaty (Maastricht) with EFTA and EU and ratified the EEA Law (EØS Loven). The Danish Parliament held a new referendum about the Lisbon Treaty with four opt-outs, which the democracy approved, even though some major riots by 'autonomists' were arranged. The four Danish judicial opt-outs concerned cooperation about civil rights, state-finances and military, in addition to the police/judicial cooperation (Europol/Eurojust). These international legal commitments are scarcely honored, due to improper cooperation. The level of international crimes have now become major threats in both nations. Nevertheless, as talked through in UU 2015.juli.10, there is no doubt that Denmark has been legally obligated for over 20 years by the Treaty (TEU - Traktaten om Den Europæiske Union). Anyways, today, Finland and Sweden, which represent about 2/3 of the Nordic population and area, are fully member of the EU.

The nature of crimes are far more comprehensive than the coldwar press indicates. As talked through in UU 2014.okt.24. "The article 'Political corruption' in Wikipedia mentions the infamous term 'cleptocracy'. The word suits well to the terminology in UU 2013.april.19. "The article mentions several types of corruption like; extortion, comradeship, scandalizing, electoral cheating, fraud, 'financial mess', bribery and mafia activities. Global corruptions concern mainly drug-trafficking, human smuggling and whitewashing of money. The annual global political corruption is estimated to be about 1 trillion \$/year, the global GWP is about 70 trd \$/y and the Norwegian (and Dane) GNP is about 1 trd Kr/y. This means that the Norwegian (and Dane) political corruption is about 2% of the state's budget, i.e. about 20 mrd kr/y. That suits the thumb-rule that there is an average of 2% disloyal employees (in most firms)." This also include terms like industrial espionage, information thefts, sabotage, pillaging, manipulation, disinformation, prostitution, slavery, narcotics, weapons, robberies, terror, and tax-fraud.

The extended 3³ sociopolitical model can be used to disclose some of the 'Underworld' Games at play that hinder the Danish authorities to fight domestic crimes. It is based on the well-known truth that humans are dishonest and ulterior by nature – and that denying that fact merely reveals dishonesty. "A classification counts 34 categories: Bad faith, Barefaced lie, Big lie, Bluffing, Bullshit, Butler lie, Contextual lie, Cover-up, Deflecting, Delusions, Dismissal, Economical with the truth, Exaggeration, Fabrication, Fib, Fraud, Half-truth, Haystack answer, Honest lie, Jocular lie, Lie-to-children, Lying by omission, Lying in trade, Minimization, Misleading and dissembling, Noble lie, Omission, Pathological lie, Perjury, Polite lie, Puffery, Speaking with forked tongue, Weasel word & White lie. Anyhow, deceptions can be of positive or negative moral and not necessarily ethical rejectable. It is however important to have system of Values like GCR (Good/Constructive/Right) in order, when facing such." (UU 2015.mars.06 and UU 2013.mars.15) This can certainly be analyzed as psychosocial Games as described in UU 2014.sept.12.

The international crimes in public sector are alarmingly high and might be larger than in non-public sectors. National penalty law demands thoroughly investigations of all well-exposed crimes in the public sector. However, it is an apparent fact that public servant seldom are charged and put to court for any criminal scandals in the public sector. Yet, the law is even stricter to the trusted public servants than for civilians. Danes have not even ratified the EU, ECHR and UN legislations properly. The Danish court do even use outdated laws to alter proper judgements (ref UU 2014.okt.24). The only plausible reason is that all of LEJ (Legislative, Executive & Judicial powers) is fatally corrupted and have been that throughout the coldwar, - and still is in these post-coldwar decades. In fact, the post-ww2 trials did not include the SU related war-crimes against European nations, but rather escalated the crimes during the coldwar. The LEJ was not repaired after the ww2, - and still is not. It appears like there might be a para-LEJ at work in both Denmark and Norway. If so, - the national LEJ is in the Game category GdE (Games d' Etat) prior to the Game CdE

(Coup d' Etat), which relates to the most serious paragraphs in any nations' penalty law. This will be analyzed in the following UUs.
